2564. "DINO-RIDERS - STEGOSAURUS" PROTOTYPE LOT. Lot includes final motorized production model for Stegosaurus, from the second series of "Dino-Riders" toys. 1989. Toy comes w/production rear leg armor and what appears to be prototype design armor on back as the areas around the "Dual Laser Canon Clusters" appear slightly different and armor is pieced together, not final painted version. This armor shows moderate aging and is Fine overall. Stegosaurus itself show It. paint wear and is Fine/VF. Comes w/hard cast resin prototype of Stegosaurus (unassembled) that is smaller in scale than final production piece. Stegosaurus's head has ink notations on it, showing a "Brain Box" design, which indicates there was at one time a plan for an evil Rulon version of this toy (which was never produced). Back plates were at one point glued in place and there is some aged glue residue along slots for these plates. Could be easily reassembled for display. VF. 2565. "DINO-RIDERS" TOY SCHEMATICS/BLUEPRINTS LOT WITH ORIGINAL ART AND UNPRODUCED DESIGNS. See previous item #2564. Lot of 16 blueprint/schematics w/designs related to the "Dino-Riders" toyline. Sizes range from 17x22" to 22x34". Four sheets feature printed designs for armor/weapons accessories. The other 12 sheets feature printed designs of proposed dinosaur toys that were never produced. These include seven sheets w/Parasaurolophus (including one

evil Rulon design) printed image and hand-drawn pencil armor/weapons designs. The other five sheets feature same set-up w/designs for Iguanodon (all evil Rulon designs) toy. These toys were designed to be larger, motorized toys in the line, each coming w/two action figures. The Parasaurolophus was initially designed to be have a motorized, running feature and be remote-controlled via a wearable AMP (device the Valorian used to communicate w/their dinosaurs in the series) necklace. We assume the Iguanodon would have a similar feature as the toys' sizes are comparable. Sheets have been stamp dated 1987 and have been rolled. Scattered handling wear as these were production designs. Scattered aging, VF overall. Great designs, including designs for two dinosaurs that were never produced in the "Dino-Riders" toy line! This book in part tells the story of the evolution of the "Dino-Riders" line and mentions Lee Volpe several times. Rest of lot consists of 10 Polaroid photos, four of which show a proposed Rulon version of the popular Diplodocus toy that never came to be. Other pictures show the "Brainbox" apparatus on an unfinished Tyrannosaurus and sculpts for the Torosaurus toy's head and armor. Varying degrees of handling wear/aging, most are VF overall. 2567. "DINO-RIDERS - TYRANNOSAURUS REX" LARGE & IMPRESSIVE BOXED BATTERY-OPERATED DINOSAUR TOY. "Dino-Riders" was a series of toys manufactured by Tyco Industries, Inc. and an accompanying cartoon series that focused on the battle between the heroic Valorians and the evil Rulons on prehistoric Earth.

The Valorians befriended dinosaurs whilst the Rulons brain-washed them. Produced beginning in 1988, there were four series of Dino-Riders toys: Series 1 (released in 1988), Series

2 (released in 1989), Series 3 and Ice Age (both released in 1990). The larger toys in the line had motorized walking action w/the dinosaur's head swaying from side to side. Rulon faction toys came w/a different self-automated trap. The dinosaurs were acclaimed for their highly detailed bodies/color and impressed the Smithsonian Institution who contacted Tyco to reproduce the dinosaurs for their "Dinosaur And Other Prehistoric Reptiles Collection." The first series of toys consisted of five Valorian and six Rulon toys and eight two-figure packs. A sixth Valorian toy, Torosaurus, was released at the end of the first series. Offered here is Tyrannosaurus Rex, the biggest dinosaur toy produced in the first series. Battery-operated, it walks forward and its fearsome jaws open and close. The toy comes w/figures of Krulos (the Rulon leader), Bitor and Cobrus as well as "Full Battle Accessories" that consists of armor and weapons that could be placed on the dinosaur, effectively turning it into a walking battle station. This toy was the highlight of the first series of toys. Comes w/mini comic book. Toy comes sealed in its original 14x22x10" deep box w/front flap that can be lifted to view contents.
