# FOSSIL RECORD

TWENTY YEARS AGO, TYCO PUT LASERS ON DINOSAURS, AND HISTORY WAS MADE



The year: 1987. Action figures were at the peak of their creativity. Toy lines like Masters of the Universe, G.I. Joe and Transformers were responsible for some of the largest playsets and widest assortments of toys ever available, as well as the biggest revenues. Before that year, the players had been Hasbro, Kenner and Mattel—toy company Tyco had yet to enter the action figure arena at all. But they entered it in a big way with their first line: Dino-Riders.

Like most 1980s toy lines, Dino-Riders revolved around two warring factions: the Valorians (the good guys) and the reptilian Rulons (the baddies). The Rulons had conquered the Valorians' home planet, and when the surviving Valorians used a time travel device to take them to prehistoric Earth, the Rulons accidentally followed them. Dinosaurs roamed wild, and the Valorians, using their telepathic powers, communicated with the dinosaurs, befriending them so they could ride around on them. The Rulons, seeking to establish a balance through M.A.D. (Mutually Assured Dinosaurs), used mind-controlling "brain boxes" to make their dinosaurs do their bidding.

The simple storyline—as explained in 14 animated episodes and a series of comic books—featured one of the most kid-friendly pairings in history, and the result was an extremely well-designed toy line that remains extremely desirable today. From the fairly small pteranodon to the gargantuan brontosaurus, kids could fit the accurate, poseable dinosaurs with futuristic weaponry. Tyco took great pains with the design of the dinosaurs and billed them as "Authentic 1/24 Scale" replicas. They were so realistic, in fact, that the Smithsonian Institute reissued several of the toys sans armor (see sidebar!)

While their cartoon was short-lived, the Dino-Riders toy line lasted four years, although the last two series were primarily available in Europe and are much more rare. The third series (by far the hardest to find today) only had three dinosaurs in it, while the fourth series, dubbed "Ice Age," abandoned dinosaurs entirely and replaced them with furry, prehistoric mammals driven by Neanderthals.

# DINOOTS, TRANSFORMED

THE 'DINO-RIDERS' VOICE CAST WAS MORE THAN MEETS THE EYE!

If you ever listened to the voices of the Dino-Riders and thought they sounded familiar, that's because they were—the higher-ups on both sides were voiced by members of two other popular factions: the Autobots and the Decepticons from *Transformers*. Here's a breakdown of which 'bot played which Rider.



**DAN GILVEZAN (QUESTAR/BUMBLEBEE)**

Questar served as the mighty leader of the Valorians, using his telepathic powers for guidance. On an unrelated note, Bumblebee liked getting captured and just not being all that useful in the original cartoon.



**PETER CULLEN (GUNNER/OPTIMUS PRIME)**

While he wasn't a head honcho like Autobot poobah Prime, Gunner was one of the lead warriors and trainers for the Valorians. Some of Optimus's good qualities must have rubbed off along with his voice patterns.



**FRANK WELKER (KRULOS/MEGATRON)**

Welker is the go-to guy for cartoon evildoers (and animals, but that's another story). Krulos was the cruel ruler of the Rulons, and Megatron was the Decepticons' biggest Tron.

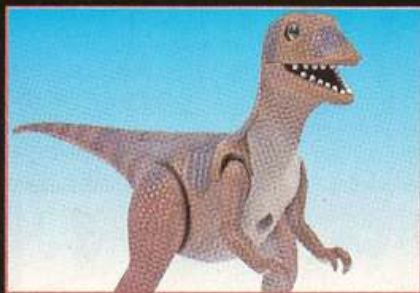


**CHRIS LATTA (RASP/STARSCREAM)**

"Rasp" should have been Latta's nickname, what with his raspy voice work (Cobra Commander, et al). Rasp and Starscream both commanded factions within their teams: the Rulon Vipers and the Decepticon jets. ■ BL

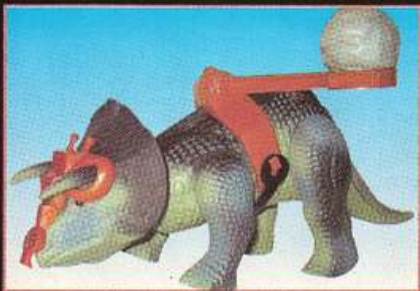
# DINO-RIDERS: EXTINCT?

## THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTE DINOSAUR COLLECTION (1992)

The scientific accuracy of its dinosaur models enabled Tyco to obtain an endorsement from the Smithsonian Institution and repackage the models as the "Dinosaur and Other Prehistoric Reptile Collection." The re-released models were virtually identical to their Dino-Rider counterparts, but without weapons or figures.



## CADILLACS & DINOSAURS (1994)

In the future, dinosaurs will come back from extinction—at least, that's what this cartoon says, and it certainly brought back the Dino-Riders. All of the dinosaur toys in Tyco's C&D line were re-used from Dino-Riders: the Kentrosaurus, the Triceratops, Hermes the Deinonychus and Zeke the Quetzalcoatlus. Wait a minute...Zeke?



## KNOCKOFFS (VARIOUS)

Although these brightly colored bootleg dinos don't come with any weapons or figures, they have battery-operated walking, roaring and eye-glowing features and are fully compatible with the Dino-Riders accessories. So far, imitations of the Stegosaurus, Torosaurus and Brontosaurus are known to exist. ■ TED NEOS

# MAKING PRE-HISTORY

'TOYFARE' SITS DOWN WITH THE TWO MEN WHO BROUGHT THE DINO-RIDERS TO LIFE

Starting a new action figure line is no small undertaking, so if you're going to do it, you want the right people on your team. Warren Bosch was the head of Research and Development at Tyco who would later work on Crash Test Dummies. Paul Kirchner was an experienced toy illustrator who had drawn comic strips for He-Man, Go-Bots and Thundercats magazines. Both of them were there for the launch of Dino-Riders, and with the help of the rest of the Tyco team and a paleontologist named "Dinosaur Bob," they made some great toys.

**ToyFare: Where did the idea for Dino-Riders come from?**

**Bosch:** Jim Allie, the executive VP of marketing, came in one morning and said that during his morning shower he had gotten this idea of combining action figures with dinosaurs. That was all he had. So I started thinking about it and woke up the next morning with the idea of having alien creatures visit the planet Earth in the ancient past and taking their advanced technology and combining it with the dinosaurs' natural abilities. Therefore a flying dinosaur would have jet packs to make it fly faster; a running dinosaur would have something to assist it to run faster, and so on.

**Paul, how did you get involved with Dino-Riders?**

**Kirchner:** They had this idea for good guys and bad guys riding dinosaurs, and they wanted someone to develop the concept. Larry Hama, a friend of mine in the comic industry who worked on G.I. Joe, recommended me for it. They had some of the most interesting ideas—they had already gotten the concept of the brain box that the bad guys put on the dinosaurs versus the telepathic communication with the good guys, but they needed a rationale of how they would be on Earth at the time of the dinosaurs and what the fight was about. I came up with the cast of characters and the backstory, and I also drew the comics that came with the toys. At one point, I had the dinosaurs being more Disney-ish and talking, and they said, "No."

**How did the first M.A.S.K.-inspired prototype come about?**

**Bosch:** I had one of our designers start on a sculpture of a deinonychus, a dinosaur that had been recently discovered. He did a terrible job of the sculpture, and we had a presentation the following day, so basically I tore it all apart and started over from scratch. It took me all night—I painted it up and took bits and pieces of things and some original parts and a figure from Kenner's M.A.S.K. line and stuck it on there, and that's the model we used for the first presentation.

**Where did you get all of your scientific data from?**

**Kirchner:** A paleontologist named Dinosaur Bob [Dr. Robert Bakker] was actually pretty involved. He was a high-profile scientist and kind of a strange character. They were trying to be as accurate as possible, but he had a conflict with marketing. For example, Tyco wanted to make the brontosaurus because it was a popular and well-known dinosaur, but he had a problem with that, because "brontosaurus" was a name that wasn't used in the scientific community.

**Were there any engineering challenges with the line?**

**Bosch:** Early on, I got in an argument with the head of the engineering department, Don Martin, about whether or not the deinonychus would stand up. All he had seen up to that point were the drawings, and he said, "You're gonna need feet the size of quarters to make it stand up." And I said, "But Don, it was a real animal! It stood up!" So I went back in the R&D department, got the model I had made and stood it on the table, and it stood up. But there were a lot of stories like that, where we had a natural animal on the one hand, and then the engineering department had the challenge of making a million of them. **TF**
